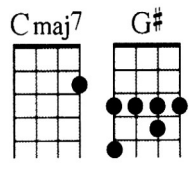


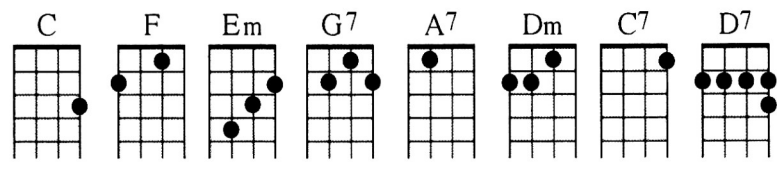


Crazy

In 1961 Patsy Cline's producer persuaded her to cut another of Willie's songs called "Crazy." It became a Number Two country hit and a huge pop crossover success for Cline. (It still remains the most played song in jukebox history)



Intro C C Dm Dm G7 C G7
 C A7 Dm

Crazy, I'm crazy for feeling so lonely
 G7 C > Dm > G7

I'm crazy, crazy for feeling so blue
 C A7 Dm

And I knew you'd love me as long as you wanted
 G7 C>F>C>C7

And then someday..you'd leave me for somebody new
 F C C7

Worry...why do I let myself worry?
 D7 G7 > Dm > G7

and wondering....what in the world did I do?
 C A7 Dm

Oh I'm crazy for thinking that my love could hold you
 F Em Dm Cmaj7

I'm crazy for crying an crazy for trying
 Dm G7 C (turn-around with G7)

And I'm crazy for loving you
 >> Repeat Verse and then end with....
